Students will explore the toys they enjoyed and the games they played during their growing up years in the Appalachian Mountains.  -Examples: marbles, hopscotch, horseshoes, crows and cranes, thimble, fox and hound, jump roping, kick the can and pick up sticks.
		Construction of Toys without purchasing materials.	Students will learn how to construct various toys without purchasing materials.  -Examples: Finger dinger, hoop rolling, Gee-Haw Whimmy Diddle, Rollie Pollie, and kick the can.

	Inventing games with partner without using purchasing equipment	With a partner, students will develop and construct a game without using any materials and teach them to the class.  Students will play and critique the games that classmates made up.
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
