

Our Lady of Fatima Parish School is a Pre-kindergarten through eighth-grade school. Our Pre-kindergarten program has classes for two-year-old, three-year-old, and four-year-old students. Our Lady of Fatima Parish School is located in Huntington, WV. Our traditional all-day Kindergarten through eighth grade provides high-quality education to the young people of the tri-state community. Our success is built on a rigorous academic program, active spiritual formation, and a commitment to stewardship virtue. Academic standards have been set high for the school, allowing students graduating from eighth grade to have earned a credit for Algebra 1 and Spanish 1 upon entering high school. Our enrollment has ranged from 100 to 170 students over the past five years. We have provided a high level of academic excellence to the greater Huntington Community for more than sixty years.

The greater Huntington area is mostly a homogenous community with ethnic groups represented in small proportions. Cabell County is only twelve percent Catholic, which has led to Catholic schools needing to branch out to students from other faith backgrounds. Demographically, our students generally come from many areas of the county, with middle-class to upper-class families represented within our school. The Parish provides annual support through a "Tuition Angels" program to help economically disadvantaged students enroll in our school. Our student body is approximately 60 percent Catholic, 30 percent Protestant, and 10 percent from other religious backgrounds. The smaller class sizes lend themselves to more personalized instruction, and teachers and students alike know everyone's name. OLOFPS considers its best asset to be the family atmosphere that is evident when you walk through the door.

Our Catholic identity is present within all our classrooms, with all students participating in morning prayer, daily religion classes, and weekly mass. Additionally, the entire student body participates in Stations of the Cross each Friday during Lent and the Our Lady of Fatima Feast Day with our May Crowning. Catholic students in Grades 2 through 8 attend Reconciliation services twice a year. Our 2nd-grade students participate in a special 1st Reconciliation service during Advent.

The Staff at Our Lady of Fatima School comes from a variety of backgrounds. We are fortunate to have teachers here who have spent their entire teaching careers within our school. We also have staff who have experienced public school as teachers, giving them a different perspective of educating children. Some of our teachers have their children currently enrolled at Our Lady of Fatima, so they experience the school both as teacher and parent. We have an excellent balance of novice and seasoned teachers, with the experienced staff willing to assist newer teachers in their quest to establish themselves in the rich tradition of Our Lady of Fatima leaders. The Principal monitors the instructional practices and student progress to ensure that all students are prepared for and have access to a challenging curriculum. The Principal also conducts frequent classroom visits and walkthrough observations to provide constructive and meaningful feedback to the faculty and staff, improving student learning.

In 1952, steps were taken to provide a grade school for Our Lady of Fatima Parish Church. The groundbreaking took place on September 4, 1953, and the new school's dedication was on Sunday, September 5, 1954. The first school year opened on September 7 with six grades and 90 students. The school was placed under the Pallottine Missionary Sisters' direction, whose motherhouse was located in Huntington.

At Our Lady of Fatima, Faith, Learning, and Service have no limits. We hold our students to high standards in all three of these areas. The students lead a life rooting in serving others and modeling their Catholic Faith throughout the community. In addition to our quality Catholic Education that students are receiving in the classroom, they also give back to the community in various ways. We have many opportunities for students in and outside of the classroom. These opportunities include enrichment classes, Title 1 services, electives, clubs, and various athletic teams. At Our Lady of Fatima, the teachers and staff continue to build a loving community that inspires students to learn through teaching gospel values during these critical developmental years.

Our Lady of Fatima Parish School continues to provide high-quality education to the tri-state community's young people. Our success has been built on a rigorous academic program, active spiritual formation, and a commitment to stewardship virtue. As a result, our alumni have gone on to successful lives in high school, college, and beyond, bearing witness to our distinctive tradition of excellence

Notable Achievements and Areas of Improvement

Our school has always been a leader in student achievement among our fellow Catholic schools and the public schools in our community. No matter which Cabell county high school our students choose to attend, they are consistently successful. While our test scores remain high, we actively work on improving our academic excellence.

Our school has a goal of producing well-rounded students who are high achievers in every phase of life. We know we are achieving this by the results of various competitions we enter every year. During the past school year, we received many awards at the Cabell County Reading Councils' annual writing contest and sent four students to the state finals. We produced a state semi-finalist in the annual GeoBee competition and a regional winner in the Cabell County Spelling Bee. We contributed over 1200 items of canned food to a local food bank last year during our Can Food Drive in terms of service.

Our Lady of Fatima uses a variety of age-appropriate assessments to evaluate our students' work and progress. As with all schools, we thoroughly analyze our annual standardized testing results to identify possible weaknesses in our curriculum. Committees of teachers take this analysis and recommend any changes needed. Daily, teachers use a variety of assessment tools to evaluate student progress. Team meetings are held periodically to evaluate the effectiveness of these classroom tools.

Each year, the staff at OLOFPS engages in meaningful staff development, including a two-day in-service, where an essential topic of discussion is student performance. Teachers break into grade-level groups and decide where improvements and changes are needed, including a new math and science program, herpetology program, and after school enrichment programs, including STEM, Newspaper Club, and Computer Science.

In the 2019-2020 school year, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston changed our standardized testing program from the Terra Nova Test to the NWEA Map Growth, which our students take at three different times throughout the school year. This assessment is computer adaptive and measures achievement and growth in our kindergarten through 8th grade math, reading, language usage, and science. MAP Growth is designed to measure student growth over time regardless of their grade level.

Student support services at our school are provided in a variety of ways. We have one teacher dedicated to helping students who need extra help in addition to what is given in the classroom. We have an extensive after-school tutoring and enrichment program for those needing help in particular subjects. We are also fortunate to provide Birth to Three Services and speech therapy through Cabell county schools resources.

The parents of our students and our parishioners are vital players in the life of the school. The Parent Volunteer Association (PVA) assists in the school's fundraising activities and provides services back to the school's students, teachers, and overall success. We invite our families to provide stewardship to the school in any way they feel comfortable. Through communication with school, church, and parents, we meet our students' best interests.

We have a solid reputation in the Huntington community. The sky is the limit for Our Lady of Fatima. Strong leadership, a group of passionate, knowledgeable, talented teachers, excellent students, and parents who want the best for their children all come together to bring success to OLOFPS. The future is bright and shining in every way for Our Lady of Fatima Parish School.




Student Demographics

Students Per Grade




■ Preschool ■ K-5th ■ Middle School

Religion




